Each summer, during the third week of July, The Stahl Companies takes a group of men into the eastern Sierras just outside of Bishop, CA where we hike, fish, boat, and have a general good time over a long weekend. The intent is purely to give the team a break from the day-to-day stresses of the business, to rest and refuel, and to connect with each other in a casual atmosphere while saying thank you to each of them and their commitment to deliver projects with expertise for the health of our communities.

Emergency Department


Providence Saint Joseph Medical Center, Burbank, CA

These last three months have seen the new Emergency Department building construction winding down as the project achieved HCAi staff and stock and HCAi final Certificate of Occupancy. The last few weeks have included finishing elevator work, furniture and

equipment installations, miscellaneous system testing, and commissioning. Hospital staff quickly began stocking the building and training in the new space, in preparation for opening in early September. It's an exciting time in Burbank!

Mercy San Juan Medical Center

Carmichael, California



The Stahl Companies was awarded third-party Project Management Services for the following Mercy San Juan projects upcoming in 2023.

Bi-Plane

Scope – renovation of the existing Radiology Department to create a new bi-plane lab along with the customary structural anchorage, plumbing, mechanical, electrical, framing, and finish work necessary to complete the remodel. The installation will also include a staff lounge, lockers, clean and soiled rooms, patient holding rooms as well as the renovation to the existing nuclear medicine suite. Anticipated construction start date is April 2023.

Cath Lab

Scope – renovation of the existing Cath Lab # 1 Suite area to accommodate a new GE Imaging System. We are currently in the SD (schematic design) phase and working on the layout which will further define the scope of work. Anticipated construction start date is July 2023.

University of Southern California Los Angeles, California



DVRC (Doheny) Project

USC purchased the vacant Doheny building in November 2021, pictured above. An assessment of this 127k sf, 4-story + basement building was conducted in April. The intent is to transition it into research center space prior to upcoming construction of a new research facility, the DTH (Discovery and Translational Hub).

Phase 1 repairs to key systems including the elevator, boiler, roof, and fire safety will be essential. Also included will be basic flooring upgrades and repair of existing hoods and facilities. This phase will be challenging, requiring the entire team to think outside the box and to be strategic. It has an aggressive schedule to make the space available for potential user-groups, particularly as transitional research space which will allow for early recruiting of world-class researchers to support the DTH.



NTT & NOR

The Air Handler project for these two buildings is ongoing. Soon, we will be kicking off a new air handler project for USC's Center for Health Professionals building.

Nuclear Medicine

This project has been closed in compliance by HCAI.





The Methodist Hospital was built in 1971. Current leadership has made it a priority to revitalize the buildings to enhance the patient, visitor, and employee experience (results, of which, are already being realized in patient and staff surveys and public rankings).

Renovations are occurring in the patient rooms, dining facilities, administrative offices, laboratory, ED, Pathology, engineering spaces, registration department, and the main lobby.

The facility has a bistro downstairs, but the café that was once in the lobby had been removed years ago. The second week of August, a renovation in the old café space was completed, and a vendor (Sunshine Café) completed the installation of their equipment, training of staff, and opened for business in the main thoroughfare for everyone who enters the building on the main floor.

Covenant Health, Hobbs Hospital Hobbs, New Mexico


